Item #6 Board Action on Public Hearings

Managing Director Warren stated the Public Hearings were held on Tuesday,

November 10, 2020 for two 2020 primary road projects.

The first hearing was for the all-season reconstruction of 84th Street from Breton

Avenue to Hanna Lake Avenue. There was one couple within the project limits that attended

the meeting. They were in favor of the project and had questions related to access. Most

property owners on this project have provided additional right-of-way and have been well

informed of the proposed work, as well as impacts to their property.

The second hearing was for the all-season reconstruction of 100th Street between

Kalamazoo Avenue and Hanna Lake Avenue. There was one couple that showed up prior to

the public hearing and had their questions answered and decided not to stay for the public hearing.

Like 84th Street, the majority of 100th Street property owners have provided drainage easements and/or temporary grading permission for the proposed road improvement and have been well informed of the proposed work and the impact it may have to their property.

Moved by Commissioner Janes, seconded by Commission Medema that the proposed improvements for the above-listed projects are authorized by the Board as presented at the Public Hearings, as recommended by staff.

Item #7 Schedule Public Hearings

Managing Director Warren requested authorization to schedule public hearings for the following 2021 Local Reconstruction Projects:

- a. 16 Mile Road between Shaner Avenue and Myers Lake Avenue, Courtland and Nelson Townships
- b. **16 Mile Road between Pennington Avenue and Algoma Avenue**, Solon Township

Deputy Managing Director Harrall stated a virtual information meeting was held on Thursday, November 19, 2020 for the project in Courtland and Nelson Township (Shaner Avenue to Myers Lake Avenue). An information meeting for the project in Solon Township (Pennington Avenue to Algoma Avenue) is anticipated to be held virtually in late November or early December.

In anticipation of the Townships moving forward with these two projects, we would like to schedule public hearings for both projects to be held on Tuesday evening, January 12, 2021. This schedule would allow tree removal work to be done in February and March.

Moved by Commissioner Janes and seconded by Commissioner Medema that the Board authorizes scheduling Public Hearings for Tuesday, January 12, 2021 at 6:30 p.m. and 7:00 p.m., as recommended by staff.

Item #8 Purchase of Right-of-Way – 100th Street

Managing Director Warren requested authorization to purchase the following rightof-way for the 84th Street reconstruction project.

Amanda and June Wheeler, **8435 Hanna Lake Avenue**, have agreed to provide additional highway easement to accommodate our 84th Street reconstruction between Breton and Hanna Lake Avenues. The easement is 17 ft. x 80 ft. (1,414 sft.); compensation is valued at \$0.98/sft. (\$1,386) and landscaping at \$400, **resulting in a total of \$1,786**.

Easement Description:

Commencing at the Northeast Corner of Section 22, T05N, R11W Gaines Township, thence S00°55'26"W 50.00 feet along the east line of Section 22; thence N89°29'16"W 33.00 feet to the westerly Right of Way line of Hanna Lake Ave and the Point of Beginning for this description; thence N89°29'16"W 86.80 feet to the westerly property line; thence N34°51'18"E 20.59 feet along said property line to the existing Right of Way line of 84th Street; thence S89°29'16"E 75.31 feet along said existing Right of Way line to the existing westerly Right of Way line of Hanna Lake Ave; thence S00°55'26"W 17.00 feet along said Right of Way to the Point of Beginning. Contains

1,414 Square Feet M/L and is subject to easements and restrictions of record.

a. 84th Street Reconstruction – Breton Avenue to Hanna Lake Avenue

Deputy Managing Director Harrall stated the 84th Street reconstruction project between Breton Avenue and Hanna Lake Avenue has an estimated cost of \$1,300,000. Funding includes \$981,450 Federal STP Urban funds with the remaining \$318,550 local match funded by KCRC.

b. 100th Street Reconstruction – Kalamazoo Avenue to Hanna Lake Avenue

Deputy Managing Director Harrall stated the 100th Street reconstruction project between Kalamazoo Avenue and Hanna Lake Avenue has an estimated cost of \$2,800,000. Project funding includes \$895,000 Federal STP Rural Funds, as well as \$1,158,467 STP Rural funds purchased from Montcalm CRC (\$932,000) and Newaygo CRC (\$226,467) with the remaining \$746,533 local match funded by KCRC.

the title sheets for the 84th Street and 100th Street reconstruction projects are signed and

executed, as recommended by staff.

Staff recommends awarding Bid #21-MNT-04: Various Road Materials to "All Bidders", whose product, when tested, meets or exceeds the technical composition requirements.

At the time of demand, the source(s) selected will be based on cost of material (inclusive of our labor and equipment costs), quality of the material, and the availability and immediate need of the material.

b. **Bid #21-MNT-05**: Winter Bituminous Patching Materials - FY 2021 requirements, as needed

At the Board meeting on November 10, 2020, staff recommended for the Board to reject the submitted proposal of Bid #21-MNT-05, in order to reissue the solicitation and receive bids for both materials.

After going out to bid for a second time, staff recommends for the Board to award Bid #21-MNT-05: Winter Bituminous Patching Materials to "All Bidders".

At the time of demand, the source(s) selected to purchase the material will be based on cost delivered or picked up (inclusive of our labor and equipment costs), type of material, project location, quantity discounts, and the availability and immediate need of the material.

c. **Bid #21-MNT-06**: Chip Seal Emulsion Materials - FY 2021 requirements with a one-year renewal option, as needed

Staff recommends awarding Bid #21-MNT-06: Chip Seal Emulsion Materials to both "Bit-Mat Products" and "Michigan Paving & Materials Company", whose product, when tested, meets or exceeds the technical composition requirements.

Buying the materials, as specified, in the best interest of the Road Commission, the source(s) selected will be based on cost of material (inclusive of our labor and equipment costs), type of material, project location, and the availability and immediate need of the material.

d. **Bid #21-MNT-07**: Fog Seal Asphalt Emulsion Materials - FY 2021 requirements with a one-year renewal option, as needed

Staff recommends awarding Bid #21-MNT-07: Fog Seal Asphalt Emulsion Materials to both "Bit-Mat Products" and "Michigan Paving & Materials Company.", whose product, when tested, meets or exceeds the technical composition requirements.

Buying the materials, as specified, in the best interest of the Road Commission, the source(s) selected will be based on cost of material (inclusive of our labor and equipment costs), type of material, project location, and the availability and immediate need of the material.

e. **Bid #21-MNT-08**: Spray Patch Mix Emulsion Materials - FY 2021 requirements with a one-year renewal option, as needed

Staff recommends awarding Bid #21-MNT-08: Spray Patch Mix Emulsion Materials to both "Bit-Mat Products" and "Michigan Paving & Materials Company", whose product, when tested, meets or exceeds the technical composition requirements.

Buying the materials, as specified, in the best interest of the Road Commission, the source(s) selected will be based on cost of material (inclusive of our labor and equipment costs), type of material, project location, and the availability and immediate need of the material.

Harrall presented a report to the Board on non-motorized trails and crossings in Kent County.
